

Encourage the children to give their drawings some extra super hero sparkle by using shiny coloured paper and glitter. To finish off their drawings, children can stick pasta shapes around the edge of their pictures to make a fantastic frame. Help the children hang up all the pictures, where they can make up their Sportacus workout by copying all the poses in their gallery!



Get your little ones to create their very own Sportacus Art Gallery by drawing their friends in their favourite Sportacus pose – here are some ideas:

## Activity 1:

### Sportacus Art Gallery

Once they have shared, ask them to think about what noises that animal makes, or how they move around. Putting on some music, get the children to move around like their favourite pet or animal and play musical statues!

After telling the story, sit in a circle and ask the children if they remember what Giseli's favourite thing is (her pet tortoise!) Ask the children what their favourite pet or animal is.

Tell your children about Giseli who lives in Brazil and has a pet tortoise called Gigi!

## Activity 3: Make a pet tortoise!

Read Giseli's story to your little ones and get them to make a pet tortoise, just like Giseli's!

What you need:

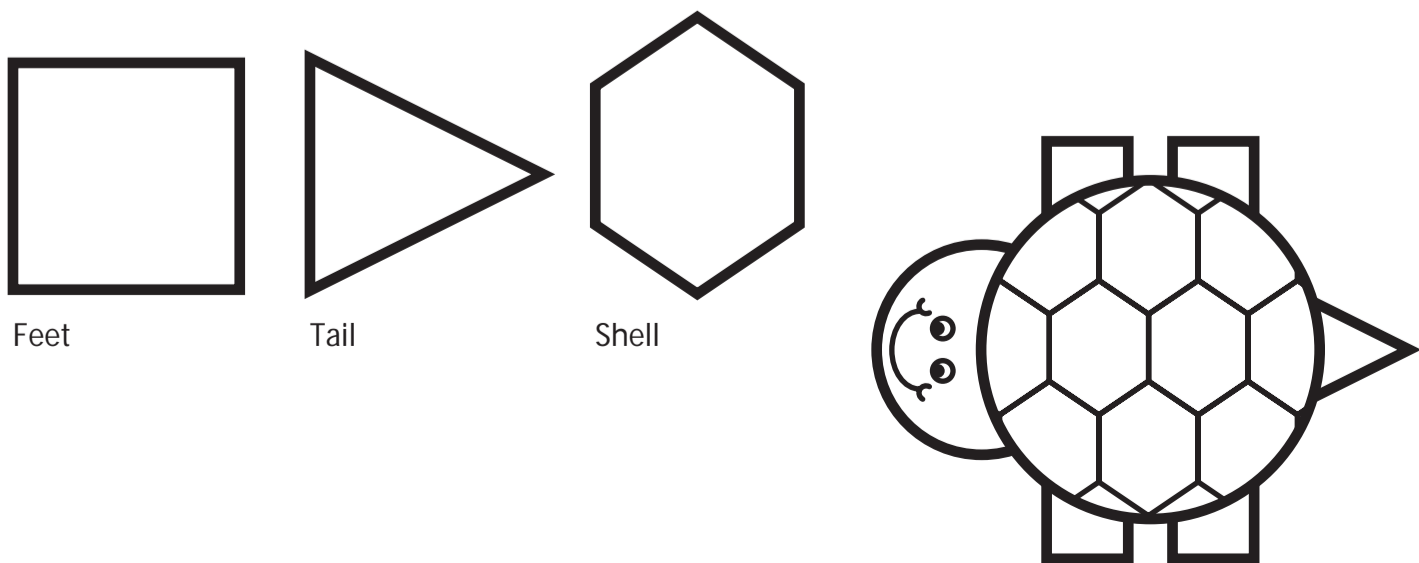
- Coloured card for head, tail and feet
- Small paper plates or bowls
- Scraps of foil, coloured card, shiny paper
- Glue
- Enlarged photocopies of this sheet, to use the shapes and tortoise template

Help the children by making card templates of the 3 shapes on this sheet.

Hand out the plates/bowls to the children explaining they are going to be the tortoise's shell. Children decorate their shells by drawing round the hexagon template on to their coloured scraps or shiny paper. They cut out and stick the hexagons on to the back of their plates/bowls.

To make the tortoise's head, draw around a cup and cut out the circle shape. To make the tail and feet, ask the children to draw round the prepared templates on to the coloured card, cut them out and stick them underneath their shell, using the tortoise picture as a guide. They can draw eyes and a smiley face on the tortoise's head.

Now their tortoise needs a name!
